As a lifelong researcher in the combined studies of artificial and natural intelligence, I would like to suggest a small addition to your integrated effort. I work now independently, full time, on a lifelong project to create a resource for understanding human learning and its relationships with artificial intelligence. Enclosed you will find a single sheet CV and a 1 page mini-grant proposal as an example of how choice small grants may invigorate efforts independent of your integrated effort, yet potentially valuable as resources for it.

Is my example a serious proposal? I am going to continue working full time on this project so long as I am able. I would be delighted with such a grant to offset the depreciation in value of my savings since retiring 20 years ago. That would forestall my having to work as a parking lot attendant or desk clerk at the building I live in. It would buy time for me to do important work. The funding level is based on \$15/hour wage level for 20 hours/week in a 50 week year, with an additional amount (\$5,000.) for research related expenses.

Last Sunday, at an Alumni meeting “Caltech in Chicago,” Caltech President Rosenbaum spoke of new work in Quantum Computing, AI, and prospects for the coming decade. My experiences and the unique resources I own (my Case Study materials and copyright control over most of written works) can help. Feynman shaped my ideas and objectives.
